BASIC Diagnostic Musculoskeletal Ultrasound for the Elbow

Course Description: The Basic Diagnostic Musculoskeletal Ultrasound for the Elbow course is designed for those who would like to gain more experience with diagnostic scanning and have a practical hands-on experience with highly experienced faculty. INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED Diagnostic Musculoskeletal Ultrasound: An Exploration of the Elbow and Forearm

8:00 a.m.-12:00 noon & 1:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m.**

Course Description: The Intermediate/Advanced Diagnostic Musculoskeletal Ultrasound Course for the Elbow and Forearm is designed take the next step for those who have the basic, standard examination of the elbow down pat, and would like to take their game to the next level. This course will start out in the morning with explorations beyond the basic elbow scan into the layers and compartments of the forearm, review the specifics of the individual common flexor and extensor tendon origins, and review regenerative treatment approaches and options for chronic tendonopathy and partial tear. In the afternoon, we will review the US intricacies of the nerves and ligaments, along with more complex dynamic evaluation of these structures and associated regional snapping syndromes. At the end of the afternoon we will assemble an expert panel to discuss their experiences with US guided procedures and regenerative medicine in this body region. Our highly experienced faculty will focus on the normal anatomy and how to scan these areas, but with more detail, while also presenting some pathology examples or injection examples where applicable. The emphasis will continue to be on scanning technique, probe position, and dynamic evaluation. Come join us and put yourself ahead of the game!
